Day 1 Wed, Feb 11, 2026 DEPART TO MOROCCO

Depart Chicago to Marrakech. *Meals: Meals on flight*



Day 2 Thu, Feb 12, 2026 MARRAKECH

Pass through immigration and customs and you will be met by your Trump Tours tour manager and local tour guide who will remain with you during the entire tour. Transfer to your hotel for check-in. Morocco's most colorful and magical city, pink-walled Marrakech is a melting pot of medieval souks, age-old traditions, high fashion, fabulous palaces and nightlife. Late afternoon visit to the medina and Djemaa El Fn'a Square of Marrakech, one of the 4 imperial cities. *A medina is a distinct historical city section that is typically walled and still is inhabited where one can find a market and shops needed for the locals.* Dinner at a local restaurant with traditional entertainment. Check into hotel for 2 nights. Welcome dinner this evening. *Hotel: 5* Sofitel Hotel or similar Meals: Breakfast, Dinner*



Day 3 Fri, Feb 13, 2026 MARRAKECH

Breakfast at the hotel. Depart to the outskirts to visit a weekly cattle market where you can see the Berbers trading sheep, goats and cattle. Light lunch at an outdoor café. In the afternoon we'll continue to explore the Marrakech medina, including the Jewish Quarter, Spice Market and Dar Si Said Museum a 19th C. palace with exquisite tilework and wood work. Afternoon return to hotel to relax, before



dinner at a roof top restaurant with traditional Moroccan food. *5* Sofitel Hotel or similar Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*

Day 4 Sat, Feb 14, 2026 SPICES AND HERBS, BERBER VILLAGE, BREAD BAKING, ORANGES

Breakfast at the hotel. Drive through the high Atlas Mountains "Ourika Valley" to visit a naturally healing botanical garden where we learn about different herbs and spices. Opportunity for a relaxing foot bath. We visit an authentic Berber village, with traditional houses built of clay, where we will have a light lunch at "Mohamed's" house. The food is local and delicious. The lady of the house will give us a bread baking lesson. Continue to our luxury eco-lodge in the desert. Literally untouched by development the Agafay desert offers quite the contrast from the hustle and bustle of Marrakech. Option for a camel ride. Dinner will be served at the Desert Lodge. *Hotel: Caravan Agafay (or similar) in luxury tent with own bathroom within the tent. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*



Day 5 Sun, Feb 15, 2026 CITRUS, ARGAN OIL, WINERY

Breakfast at the camp. Visit to a high tech citrus and olive farm. Learn about the water and irrigation challenges and how they use solar energy for electricity. **Tour and Lunch at the Winery Val d'Argan** a producer of top Moroccan wines. After lunch visit the oldest argan oil women's cooperative and learn about their mission. Opportunity to shop for oils. Argan trees produce a nut that is pressed for its valuable oil. It is used for edible goods and cosmetics and said to have healing properties. Continue to the idyllic seaside town of Essaouira. Check into centrally located Riad. *A riad is a bed and breakfast in a traditional Moroccan and Andalusian house with an interior garden or courtyard, exquisite tile and*

handwork detail and palace architecture. *Riad al Madina or similar* Dinner and overnight at the *Riad al Madina* Meals: *Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner*



Day 6 Mon, Feb 16, 2026 ESSAOUIRA

Breakfast at your Riad. **Guided tour of Essaouira**, including the Portuguese Scala, the port, the Jewish Quarter and the Medina. You will feel comfortable navigating this town on your own. Afternoon at your leisure to explore or relax in your centrally located Riad. Be sure to explore the town around 5pm when the locals are doing their daily shopping. Dinner on own. *Riad al Madina or similar.* Meals: *Breakfast*

Day 7 Tues, Feb 17, 2026 VEGETABLES, GREENHOUSES

Breakfast at the Riad. Departure to Agadir (ca. 3h). Lunch on own in Agadir. Afternoon **visit to the progressive green houses of INRA.**

The Technology Transfer Center was created in 2005 by the Association of Producers and Exporters of Fruits and Vegetables (APEFEL) in partnership with the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and the Ministry of Agriculture. INRA plays an important role in experimentation, training and popularization for production techniques for vegetable crops. Visit bean and bell pepper farms and packing station. Most of the produce is exported to Europe and some to Eastern United States. Return to Agadir and check into your hotel at the beach. Buffet dinner included at the hotel. *Hotel: 5* The View Hotel* Meals: *Breakfast, Dinner*



Day 8 Wed, Feb 18, 2026 FLIGHT TO FES

Breakfast at the hotel. Early transfer to the airport. Flight to Fes. Note: There may be a baggage fee for this domestic flight. Arrival Fes, one of the four Imperial Cities and check into hotel. After lunch (on your own) we **visit Fes El Bali walled medina**, with medieval Moorish architecture, vibrant souks and old-world atmosphere., founded in the 8th century, is a hallmark of Moorish and Moroccan architecture styles. The Medina with its colorful souks, small alleys and shops is listed as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**. The Chouara Tannery from the 11th century is one of the oldest tanneries in the world. Learn how cow, sheep and camel leather is tanned and turned into beautiful leather products. Visits will include the Mederssa Al Bouanania, El Ghazi Museum, the tanneries, Seffarine Copper Market, Mly Driss Mausoleum, Bab Boujloud and the Jewish quarter with the Synagogue. Return to hotel to relax. Dinner at hotel or nearby. *Hotel: 5* Marriott Jnane Palace Hotel.* Meals: *Breakfast, Dinner*



Day 9 Thurs, Feb 19, 2026 FES AGRICULTURE UNIVERSITY, OLIVE OIL TASTING

Breakfast at the hotel. Travel to Meknes one of the 4 imperial cities, to visit one of the **top agricultural universities of the country**. We will tour the university and have a short **presentation on the Moroccan "Green" agricultural project** which is a government initiative to support farmers. Visit a **progressive greenhouse farm with one of the Morocco's largest nurseries providing olive, apple, and other stone fruit trees to the market followed by olive tasting** to learn about the different types of olive oils. Short visit

to Meknes to see the monumental Al Mansour Gate arches and mosaic tiling which is the main ceremonial entrance

to the city, the olive and pastry market and a short excursion into the bustling Medina. Return to Fes for overnight. Dinner on your own. *Hotel: 5* Marriott Jnane Palace Hotel. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch*



Day 10 Fri, Feb 20, 2026 RABAT, BLUE VILLAGE, ROYAL PALACE

Breakfast at the hotel. Travel to Rabat, the modern capital of Morocco and home to the Royal Palace. Moors expelled from Spain had a big influence on this area and still evident in the medieval architecture. Resting along the shores of the Bouregreg River and the Atlantic Ocean, it's known for landmarks that speak to its Islamic and French-colonial heritage, including the impressive fortress Kasbah of the Udayas. This Berber-era royal fort is surrounded by formal French-designed gardens and overlooks the ocean. The city's iconic Hassan Tower, a 12th-century minaret, soars above the ruins of a mosque. Inside the 11th-century fortress walls **the blue village**, a small neighborhood of enchanting winding lanes rimmed by Andalusian-style houses and narrow blue-and-white lanes. Quick lunch on own. Continue to Casablanca. Visit the Mosque Hassan II, the second biggest mosque in the world. Afternoon free for personal interests. The walled medina, just across from is filled with dozens of traditional shops where you will have the opportunity for last minute shopping. **Farewell dinner at the famous "Rick's Café"**. *Hotel: 5* Hyatt Regency Casablanca. Meals: Breakfast, Dinner*

Day 11 Sat, Feb 21, 2026 RETURN HOME

Breakfast at the hotel. Transfer to airport for flight home. Flight will have one or two connections and you will arrive to Chicago on the same day. *Meals: B, Meals on flight*

Day 1 Fri, Feb 6 DEPART TO PORTUGAL

Depart Chicago to Porto. *Meals: Meals on flight*

Day 2 Sat, Feb 7 PORTO

Arrival Porto. Private transfer to hotel. Porto is at the mouth of the Douro River, expelling into the Atlantic Ocean. The city has half a million inhabitants and is the third largest city in Portugal. Porto is a market town, rich with traders, is shown through its astounding architecture. It is known as "The Baroque City" with narrow, winding streets dense with buildings. Dinner included. 4* Hotel Porto. Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

Day 3 Sun, Feb 8 PORTO

After breakfast, visit the town of Porto for a walking tour. Port wine hales from this region and the tour will end with a port wine tasting. Lunch and dinner on own. 4* Hotel Porto. Meals: Breakfast

Day 4 Mon, Feb 9 FATIMA

Breakfast at hotel and depart. The first visit of the day is to a cork factory to learn about the process of stripping the bark of the cork oak (*Quercus suber*). This region has been exploiting the cork oak since the 2nd Century. The trunks are peeled where the first layer, full of resin, is used for corkboards or thermal insulation. Every 8 to 12 years, the secondary layers can be harvested for the production of bottle corks and other items. This region is the world leader in cork production. Continue to visit a dairy farm. Lunch included. End the day in Fatima. The city of Fatima serves as a Catholic pilgrimage site due to the fact that in 1917 three shepherd's children returned from tending sheep and saw an apparition resembling the Virgin Mary that spoke to them. Dinner included. 4* Hotel Fatima. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner

Day 5 Tue, Feb 10 FATIMA-LISBON

After breakfast depart to the monastery of Saint Mary of the Victor in Batalha with an abbey dated to the 12th C. A part of the UNESCO heritage site faculty, it has been an important part of Portugal's history. Lunch included. Technical visit of the hacienda which has 50,000 acres and specializes in wheat farming, wine, rice, olives, feedstuffs, cattle and

horses. They also have an intensive forestry management program for their pines, eucalyptus and other trees that are utilized for wood production. Dinner on own. 4* Hotel Lisbon. Meals: Breakfast, Lunch

Day 6 Wed, Feb 11 LISBON

Breakfast at hotel. Touring of Lisbon starting with a visit to the Castle of Sao Jorge with a stunning view of the city. Continue through the maze of alleyways of the Alfama, Lisbon's oldest quarter. Continue to the Belem district to visit the Belem Tower. Lunch on own and free time in afternoon. Farewell dinner with Fado Show showcasing traditional music of Portugal. 4* Hotel Lisbon. Meals: Breakfast, Dinner

Day 7 Thu, Feb 12 FLY to MARRAKECH

Breakfast at hotel. Depart to airport for flight to Marrakech. *Meals: Breakfast*
